## **I. Aim**

### **Understanding Human Security**

In the post-Cold War era a new concept of “Human Security” has emerged, focusing on protecting human lives against pestilence, poverty, environmental destruction, climate change and disputes. This concept has attracted considerable attention, replacing the conventional idea of “National Security”, which focuses on armaments. Following this present trend, the Japanese government has been moving toward incorporating this new concept of “Human Security” as the central basis for international cooperation. Especially in developing countries, with their cultural diversity and varied levels of economic development, many people have spent their lives in danger against a background of poverty, disasters, poor environmental hygiene, malnutrition, and social unrest, including active disdain for human dignity. In addition, international epidemics such as HIV/AIDS, SARS, and COVID-19, environmental and food pollution, terrorism and drug trafficking jeopardize human security across borders.

### **Intellectual Contribution to the World**

The “human insecurity” of the 21st century is caused by a very wide range of factors. Therefore, to address the aforementioned problems both in theory and practice, those in leadership positions must have acquired multiple perspectives beyond conventional academic disciplines and methodologies must be in place that incorporate interdisciplinary skills and knowledge.

Tohoku University initiated the International Post-Graduate Program in Human Security in April 2005 by linking the Graduate School of Agricultural Science, the Graduate School of Medicine, the Graduate School of International Culture (until 2017), and the Graduate School of Environmental Studies. This program aims to make intellectual contributions to the realization of Human Security worldwide.

The Human Security program is currently composed of four programs: “Food & Agriculture for Human Security”, “Public Health Sciences for Human Security”, “Human Security and Environment”, and “Human Security and Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR)”. Each graduate school provides curricula designed to develop an understanding of the intricate structure of various problems related to Food, Health, Environment, DRR, and Regional Community.

### **Training of Experts, Researchers and Thinkers**

The International Post-Graduate Program in Human Security is designed to train the current and next generations of leaders and experts who will actively participate in policy planning and regional communities at the international and domestic levels.

Both Japanese and international candidates, as well as post-graduate students, are considered for admission. Applicants must demonstrate competence in either engineering, science, medical science, social and disaster sciences, and the potential for leadership in the

field of Human Security.

## **II. Curriculum and degree**

---

### **A. Curriculum**

The “Human Security and Environment” program and the “Human Security and Disaster Risk Reduction” program are composed of Compulsory Core Subjects, Basic and Major Subjects, a Dissertation, and Extra Lectures.

1. Common Subjects and Major subjects: Interdisciplinary study that the program will take charge of.
2. Common Subjects and Major Subjects: Study for the specialized field in the Graduate School of Environmental Studies.
3. Master’s Thesis and Seminar (by Advisor)  
Students are required to attend Seminars regularly and write and defend their Master’s thesis in the 2nd year under their supervisor’s instruction.
4. Doctoral Dissertation and Seminar (by Advisor)  
Students are required take a Doctoral course seminar in their 1st year and participate in Doctoral course training from their 2nd year. Training focuses on writing and defending the doctoral thesis.

### **B. Degree**

Students must acquire at least the following credits to be awarded a degree.

**Master’s Course** (two-year course): at least 30 credits, including the following:

1. Common Subject, Basic Subjects of Specialized Fields and Subjects of Specialized Fields given in the Graduate School of Environmental Studies
2. Master’s thesis and Seminar

**Doctoral Course** (three-year course): at least 16 credits, including the following:

1. Basic Subjects of Interdisciplinary Fields given in the Graduate School of Environmental Studies
2. Doctoral Dissertation and Seminar

Master’s degrees will be conferred with the title of “Master of Disaster Science”, “Master of Interdisciplinary Studies”, or “Master of Environmental Studies”. Doctoral degrees will be conferred with the titles “Doctor of Philosophy (Disaster Science)”, “Doctor of Philosophy (Interdisciplinary Studies)”, or “Doctor of Philosophy (Environmental Studies)”.

### **C. Program Completion Certificate**

Students must complete the required compulsory subjects specified by the program to be awarded a program completion certificate.

### **III. Admission**

---

#### **1. Admission Policy**

##### **A. Tohoku University**

###### Philosophy & Mission

With over 100 years of history and distinguished traditions, Tohoku University has developed excellence in education and research under its principles of "Research First," "Open Doors," and "Practice-Oriented Research and Education" since its establishment in 1907. The university will maintain these traditions while looking toward even more dramatic progress in the future. As a world-leading center of education and research, it will contribute greatly to the human race by grappling with the difficult and complex issues facing the 21st century. Tohoku University will focus its efforts of its faculties, graduate schools, and research institutes to foster ethical international leaders who will carry humanity into the future, while expanding its globally renowned creative research for the benefit of society at large.

###### Characteristics

###### 1) Three Foundational Ideals

"Research First," "Open Doors," and "Practice-Oriented Research and Education" — soon after its founding, Tohoku University established this set of unique ideals, the substance of which it is continually developing in response to our changing times.

###### 2) Rich Educational Environment

Tohoku University has numerous research organizations and facilities, primarily comprising 10 undergraduate schools, 15 graduate schools, 3 professional graduate schools, and 6 research institutes. Research institute staff also participate in educational activities (there are approx. 3,000 instructors; enrollment limits are approx. 2,400 for undergraduates, 2,700 for graduate students).

###### 3) Research University

Tohoku University is a school that continuously produces numerous internationally recognized research results and concertedly pushes forward with leading-edge research and education.

###### 4) Active Regional/Industrial-Academic Ties

The university is actively working to expand its diverse regional and industrial ties.

###### 5) Globalizing Education and Research

Among Japan's national universities, Tohoku University is one of the top schools in terms of agreements with overseas universities. It is actively expanding exchange in education and research. The university strives to foster globally active individuals through strong support for studying abroad by Japanese students, as well as recruitment of numerous international students.

###### Ideal Tohoku University Applicants

Tohoku University seeks students who sympathize with the university's principles and who are motivated by:

- ① the desire to make outstanding contributions as world-class researchers by addressing the issues facing humanity in the 21st century, and
- ② the desire to make outstanding contributions to the development of society as highly specialized professionals who possess abundant knowledge and leadership.

To realize these ambitions, students should also have strength of will, academic curiosity, a broad perspective, and an excellent foundation of specialized knowledge and abilities.

## Tohoku University Admissions Process (Graduate School)

Depending on the number and type of candidates sought, Tohoku University graduate schools provide multiple categories of, and opportunities for undergoing, entrance exams to meet the needs of candidates from diverse backgrounds. Schools may evaluate the candidate's qualifications, abilities, and specialization using interviews, application documents such as research plans, proficiency exams, and external tests.

### **B. Tohoku University Graduate School of Environmental Studies**

By bringing together the multidisciplinary knowledge of Tohoku University, the Graduate School of Environmental Studies (GSES) aims to establish environmental science as an integrated discipline that transcends the traditional divisions of the humanities and sciences in order to establish a culture supporting sustainable development as well as technologies and systems needed to establish resource-circulating societies. To achieve this goal, GSES has set the educational objective of fostering individuals equipped with a combination of broad knowledge and deep expertise relevant to the understanding and solving of environmental problems. By effectively integrating insights from existing academic fields while creating new frontiers of knowledge, GSES seeks to foster environmental professionals capable of playing an active role in the international community. GSES is looking for students who share these goals. We especially welcome applicants with a strong desire and ability to carry out study and research, and the fundamental academic skills needed to achieve their goals.

Six entrance examination subject-groups are conducted to match the varying expertise of applicants. In each subject-group, students are selected through six different examination procedures: General Selection, Special Selection for Recommended Students, Special Selection for Working Persons, Special Selection for International Students, and Special Selection for Graduates of the Early Graduation System. Selection is made based on the applicant's motivation to conduct research in line with the educational goals of GSES, as well as academic knowledge and outstanding research capabilities.

(Master's course (2 years))

In the General Selection examination, applicants are required to take a written examination to evaluate their specialized knowledge in the relevant field, logical thinking, and ability to write an essay about a specific topic. In addition, applicants must sit an oral examination or interview (here in after referred to as the "oral examination") to evaluate their motivations and research ability as well as their capacity to carry out environmental science in an integrated setting. The selection process is based on a comprehensive evaluation that includes the results of both the written and oral examination, with emphasis placed on the written examination's outcome.

Although the content of the examinations for the Special Selection examinations differs according to the characteristics of the targeted applicants, the evaluation and scoring procedure is essentially the same as that of the General Selection examination. However, in the case of the examination for the Special Selection for Working Persons, the relevance of the applicant's professional experience to the proposed research topic is assessed during the oral examination. In the case of the Special Selection for International Students examination in the Humanities and Social Science Group, whether the applicant's Japanese proficiency is sufficient for research will also be assessed. In all fields, we expect applicants to have acquired the English language skills necessary for writing and discussing research papers as well as understanding the fundamentals of each specialized field before entering the GSES master courses.

(Doctoral course (3 years))

The General Selection examination may include a written component to ascertain if applicants possess a high level of specialized knowledge in the relevant academic field. However, in particular, the oral examination will be used to comprehensively evaluate the applicant's ability to think logically and formulate a research plan based on a critical consideration of previous research.

In the same way, although the examinations of the Special Selection for Working Persons and the Special Selection for International Students may also include a written examination to assess the applicant's possession of specialized knowledge, selection will mainly be made on the quality of the research proposal along with the applicant's motivation and sense of mission to carry out academic research in a university setting. In the Special Selection for Working Persons and the Special Selection for International Students, while the applicant's expertise may be assessed through a written examination if necessary, selection is mainly based on the oral examination.

In all fields, we expect applicants to have acquired both advanced skills and fundamental knowledge in their respective fields of specialization as well as the ability to orally present research in academic conferences and publish academic papers.

## **2. Application procedure**

### **A. Conditions for application**

**Applicants must have been accepted as a final candidate for the Project for Human Resource Development Scholarship (Laos, Bangladesh) by JICA, and satisfy one of the following conditions:**

#### **1) Applicants for the Master's Course must satisfy one of the following conditions:**

- (1) Have graduated or expect to graduate from a university in Japan by September 2026.
- (2) Have acquired or expect to acquire a Bachelor's degree from a higher education institution approved as a National Institution for Academic Degrees and Quality Enhancement of Higher Education of Japan by September 2026.
- (3) Completed or expect to complete 16 years of education in a foreign education institution by September 2026.
- (4) Have completed or expect to complete 16 years of foreign education in Japan through a correspondence course of a foreign university or school while residing in Japan by September 2026.
- (5) Have or expect to complete 16 years of a foreign education at an educational institution located in Japan by September 2026.
  - ※ The educational institution shall have been approved by the educational system of that country and designated by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology of Japan.
- (6) Be conferred or expect to be conferred a degree equivalent to a bachelor's degree upon completion of a curriculum that has a course term of three years or longer at a university or other school (limited to schools whose overall educational and research activities have been evaluated by the relevant country's government or a government-approved individual, or are designated separately as having met this requirement by the Minister of Education) in a foreign country (including cases in which the student completed the curriculum by taking subjects conducted via distance learning while the student resided in Japan, and cases in which the student has completed a curriculum at an educational facility that is positioned within that country's educational system as per the previous item) by September 2026.
- (7) Have graduated from a specialized course of a professional school designated by the

Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology of Japan, on or after the date fixed by the Minister, or are expected to graduate by September 2026.

※ A specialized course shall be more than 4 years and meet other criteria stipulated by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology of Japan.

- (8) Have been designated as eligible by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology of Japan.
- (9) Have entered a graduate school of another university according to Clause 2 of Article 102 of the School Education Law, and be deemed by the graduate school of Tohoku University to have a sufficient eligibility to study at that graduate school.
- (10) Be 22 years of age or older by the end of September 2026 and, through individual entrance qualification screening, be deemed by the Graduate School of Environmental Studies, Tohoku University to have achieved an academic standard equivalent to or more than that of those who have graduated from a university.

\*1 Applicants need to consult with a possible supervisor about the intended area of research prior to the application.

\*2 Applicants corresponding to (6) need to contact the administration office by April 17, 2026 to check eligibility.

\*3. Applicants corresponding to (9) and (10) must submit the required documents for the application qualification to the administration office by April 17, 2026. The document format is provided by the administration office.

\*4. The Graduate School of Environmental Studies does not apply the qualification for admission regarding "A person who was enrolled in a university for at least three years, and furthermore who is found, by the Tohoku University Graduate Schools, to have achieved excellent results in acquiring the prescribed credits".

## **2) Applicants for the Doctoral Course of the program must satisfy one of the following conditions:**

- (1) Have acquired or expect to acquire a Master's or Professional degree by September 2026.
- (2) Have acquired a degree on par with a Master's or Professional degree abroad, or expect to acquire one, by September 2026.
- (3) Have acquired or expect to acquire a Master's or Professional degree abroad through a correspondence course while residing in Japan by September 2026.
- (4) Have acquired or expect to acquire a Master's or Professional degree at an educational institution located in Japan that is designated by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology of Japan by September 2026.
- (5) Have completed a course at the United Nations University, and have acquired or expect to acquire a degree equivalent to a Master's degree by September 2025.
- (6) Have completed a course at an educational institution which runs courses from a foreign school or graduate school, or completed that of United Nation University, and be admitted to have achieved an academic standard equivalent to or more than those who possess a Master degree by passing the exam and eligibility screening in accordance with Clause 2 of Article 16 of the Graduate School Establishment Standards.
- (7) Be designated by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology of Japan as follows;
  - i. Engaged in research activities in universities or research institutes for more than 2-years after graduation, with an academic ability deemed by the eligibility screening of the Tohoku University to be equivalent to those who obtained a Master's or Professional degree.
  - ii. Engaged in research activities in universities or research institutes for more than 2-years after completing a formal 16-year school education abroad or 16-year of

foreign education in Japan through a correspondent course of a foreign university or school while residing in Japan, with an academic ability deemed by the eligibility screening of the Tohoku University to be equivalent to those who obtained a Master's or Professional degree.

- (8) Be 24 years of age or older by the end of September 2026 and, through individual entrance qualification screening, be deemed by the Graduate School of Environmental Studies, Tohoku University to have achieved an academic standard equivalent to or more than those who obtained a Master's or Professional degree.

\*1 Applicants need to consult with a possible supervisor about the research plan in this program prior to the application.

\*2 Applicants corresponding to (7) need to contact the possible supervisor by April 17, 2026 to check eligibility.

\*3 Applicants corresponding to (8) need to contact the administration office by April 17, 2026 to check eligibility.

## **B. Submission of Applications**

Applicants should use The Admissions Office (hereinafter referred to as TAO), the designated online application system, to complete the following application procedures within the application period.

### **1) Application period: Entrance Examination for October 2026.**

Applications for the **Master's course** and **Doctoral course** will be accepted **from 9:00 on May 8, 2026 to 16:00 on May 21, 2026 (Japan time)**.

(13) Residence Record (Issued by the mayor of a city, ward, town, or village in Japan)

- Should be submitted by foreign applicants residing in Japan whose period of stay is over 90 days.

- Should be issued after March 2026 and indicate residence status without an individual Number.

- Applicants who are enrolled as research students of our Graduate School at the time of application and will continue to be enrolled until September 2026 are not required to submit this certificate.

### **3. Entrance Examination**

#### **1) The number of students to be admitted:**

Quotas for the Master's course and Doctoral course are highly limited. The entrance date is scheduled for October.

Students will be accepted into the Department of Frontier Sciences for Advanced Environment (Disaster Science or Cultural Environmental Studies).

#### **2) Examination date and details**

The oral entrance examination (i.e., the interview) will take place remotely (via Google Meet, etc.) from June 22 to July 3, 2026. Precise dates and details of this exam will be provided by the applicant's requested supervisor.

**Note:** Applicants are required to communicate with prospective supervisors before submitting their application documents.

#### **3) Examination admission ticket**

Please download it from TAO, print it on A4-size white paper, and present it on the day of the test. The start date for downloading will be announced in a message from TAO.

### **4. Screening**

Successful applicants will be selected in accordance with the tallied scores from the oral examination (i.e., the interview), language ability and submitted documents. During the interview, applicants must make a 15-minute presentation of their previous and intended research. This will then be followed by 25-minutes of Q&A to gauge the research ability of applicants.
